

Janani Suraksha Yojna (JSY)

1. Introduction and Objectives:- JSY, a safe motherhood intervention was introduced by making some changes in NMBS to reduce Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) and Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) by promoting institutional delivery among the poor pregnant women.

2. Eligibility & scale of Cash Assistance:- From 12-04-2005 JSY was started by Govt. of India in rural areas and from 01-04-2006 this geographic inequality had been removed by including Below Poverty Line (BPL) ladies of urban areas also. From 31-10-2006 JSY benefits has been extended to SC/ST pregnant women irrespective of BPL card.

For speedy implementation of scheme Gram Panchayat (GP)/Municipal Committee (MC) has been declared nodal agency for attestation of BPL status of family wherever yellow card are not available by state of Punjab.

There is cash incentive of Rs. 500/- to all BPL/SC/ST women above 19 years of age, up to two living children irrespective of sex of the child at the time of home delivery and additional Rs. 200/- and Rs. 100/- for institutional delivery to Rural (Total Rs. 700/-) and Urban (Total Rs. 600/-) pregnant women respectively for delivering in a government or private accredited Institution.

3. Budget and disbursement of Cash Assistance:- Budget for the scheme is released by the Govt. of India through Mission Director NRHM (National Rural Health Mission) with effect from 12-04-2005. The scheme is cent percent centrally sponsored and it integrates cash assistance with delivery and post-delivery care. Cash Assistance to the mother is mainly to meet the cost of delivery and given by bearer cheque only.

4. Cost of Caesarean Section or management of Obstetric complications:- Where Government specialists are not available in the Govt's health institution to manage complications or for Caesarean Section, assistance up to Rs. 1500/- per delivery can be utilized by the health institution for hiring services of specialists from

the private sector. Even specialist doctors working in the other Government set-ups are empanelled, provided his/her services are spare and he/she is willing. In such a situation, the cash subsidy can be utilized to pay honorarium or for meeting transport cost to bring the specialist to the health centre.

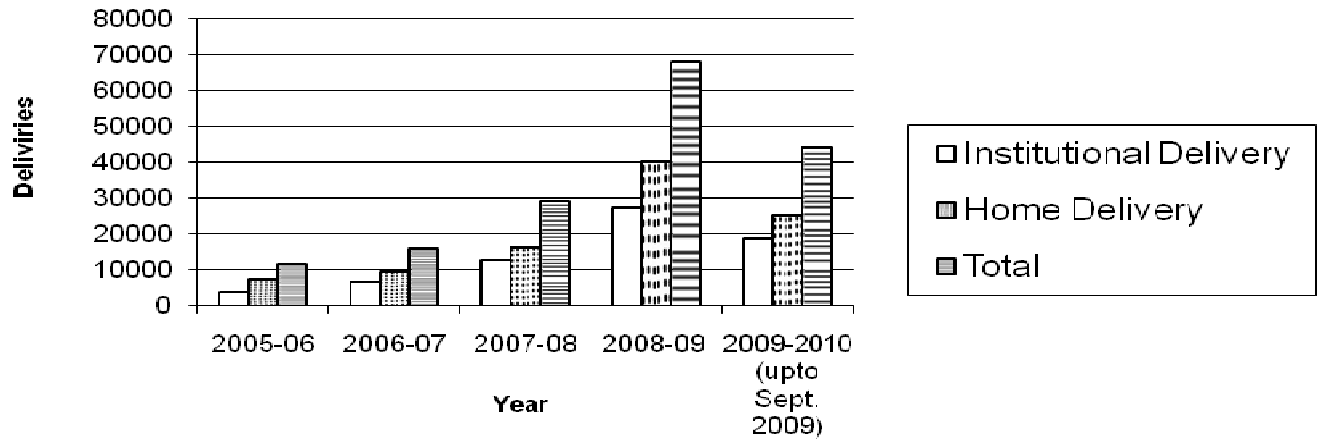
5. JSY Benefits in Accredited Private Health Institution:- In order to increase choice of delivery care institutions, at least two willing private institutions per block are accredited to provide delivery services as per GOI guidelines. Such beneficiaries delivering in these institutions would get the cash benefits admissible under JSY. 227 such private institutions are empanelled for delivery under JSY.

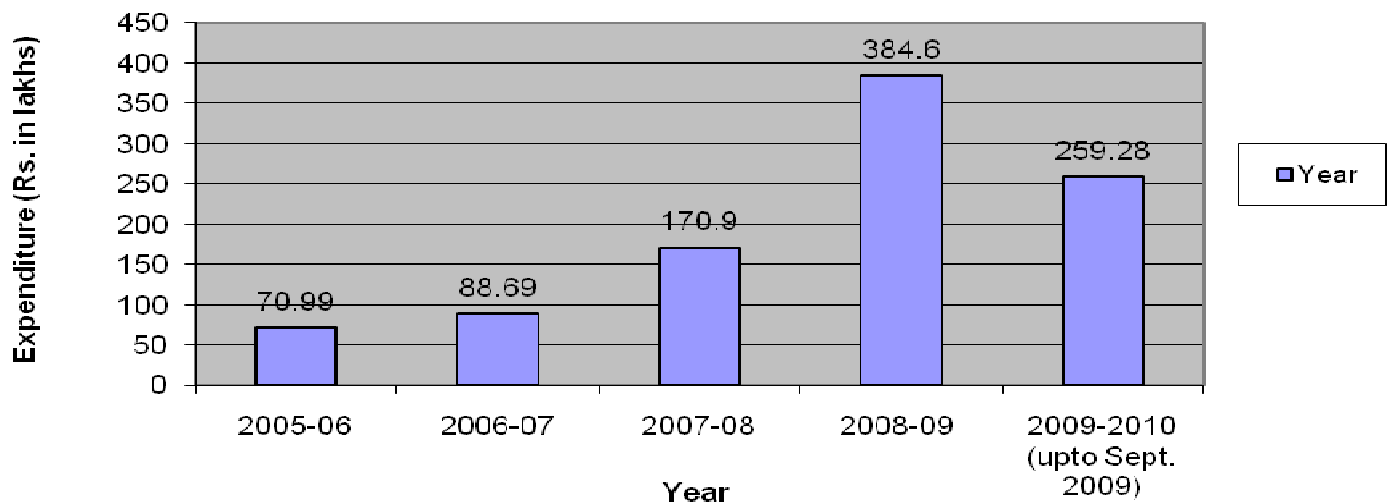

As per road map given by GOI in the financial year 2008-09, 65% of the eligible beneficiaries i.e. 58500 out of 90000 were to be given the benefit of JSY which has been well achieved by providing JSY benefits to 75.46% of the total beneficiaries i.e. to 67911 beneficiaries.

Among 65% of the eligible beneficiaries i.e. 58500, 70% i.e. 40950 should have been institutional deliveries which is 27561(30.46% of the total JSY beneficiaries, 47.11% of the target i.e. 58500 beneficiaries and 40.58% for the 67911 beneficiaries) in the F.Y 2008-09.

By Information Education & Communication (IEC)/Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) activities, with the help of officers/officials and community, State of Punjab will achieve its goal of Institutional deliveries in the F.Y. 2009-10.
